

CORRIGENDUM TO THE REPORT: THE COST OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TO THE AUSTRALIAN ECONOMY

Table 6 on page 9, and table 7 on page 10, in part II of the report are incorrect. The corrected tables appear below. Furthermore, the corresponding sentences referring to these calculations should read:

On page VI in Part I of the report:

*It is also estimated that there were a similar number of perpetrators of domestic violence, **87%** of which were male...*

On page 17 in Part I of the report:

*To a first approximation, this implies that there were about 408,000 perpetrators of DV in the previous 12 months (see Part II, Section 4), **87%** of which were male.*

The corrections to these tables do not materially affect the key results and conclusions of the report, other than very minor second-order impacts primarily on some of the productivity estimates.
