Family Law Research –

The Australian Institute of Family Studies (AIFS) has been commissioned by Australia's National Research Organisation for Women's Safety (ANROWS) to undertake research in relation to the **compliance with and enforcement of family law parenting orders**. The research involves multiple studies, including a survey of parents and carers.

National Strategic Framework for Information Sharing between the Family Law and Family Violence and Child Protection Systems -

The Family Safety Information Sharing Team within the Attorney-General's Department has been working closely with state and territory colleagues and the family law courts on progressing the detailed development of the National Framework. They are now at a point in its development where they would highly value feedback from the wider family law sector on several key issues. As such, a [Consultation Paper](#) on the National Framework outlines the key arrangements currently being considered and seeks your views on a number of key focus questions.

Safe and Together (Domestic & Family Violence) Conference, Qld Summit (online) -

The Safe and Together Institute (STI) in partnership with the Office of Chief Practitioner (Queensland Government) will join with partners to celebrate Queensland progress (since 2015) in the adoption of the Safe and Together practice model. The model addresses the intersection of domestic violence and child welfare.

[The Queensland Summit](#), to be held on **2-3 September**, will include an address from the Minister for Children, Youth Justice and Multicultural affairs. The Summit is an accessible learning and development opportunity and will present a wide range of ways that the Safe and Together approach has been used in Queensland in multiple settings. Workshops will be broadly looking at work with children and families but will also include a specific focus on fathers, on the voice of survivors, on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families, on court settings, on coercive control and on the context of High Risk (multi-agency) Teams.

Presenters will include **David Mandel** (STI), **Dr Heather Nancarrow** (Griffith Uni), **Professor Cathy Humphreys** (Melbourne Uni), **Jess Hill** (author 'See what you made me do') and **Rodney Vlais** (Consultant).
